# Airport Arrivals



All passengers regardless of nationality must meet one of the following conditions:

- to have completed the vaccination for COVID-19 at least fourteen days (14) before the scheduled arrival and present a vaccination certificate in Greek, English, French, German, Spanish, Italian or Russian, issued by a public authority in accordance with the relevant legislation.
- display a negative molecular test result for COVID-19 (PCR) performed within the last seventy-two (72) hours before the scheduled arrival or a negative Rapid Antigen test result performed up to 48 hours before the scheduled flight.
- To present proof of recovery from Covid-19, supported by test result (PCR or Rapid Antigen test). The certificate of recovery is issued thirty (30) days after the 1st positive diagnosis & is valid up to 180 days there on.

It is **compulsory** that all passengers travelling to/via Greece fill in and electronically submit the Passenger Locator Form (PLF) at least 24hrs before departure. **The Form can be found at** <https://travel.gov.gr/#/>

On the day of your departure, you will receive a barcode (QR) that will be scanned on arrival to determine whether you will be tested or not.

If the result is positive, arriving visitors will be quarantined for 10 days.

The use of masks is mandatory inside airport terminals and on board the flight.



# Archaeological Sites Museums

---

- up to 20 visitors can enter as a group (outdoor archaeological sites)
- Up to 7 visitors can enter as a group (indoor museums)
- use of protective masks and alcohol-based sanitizers on site strongly advised outdoors and required indoors
- use of audio-guides is mandatory for tours with guides
- Entry into indoor museums only for vaccinated guests or with a negative rapid antigen test



# Beaches & Boats

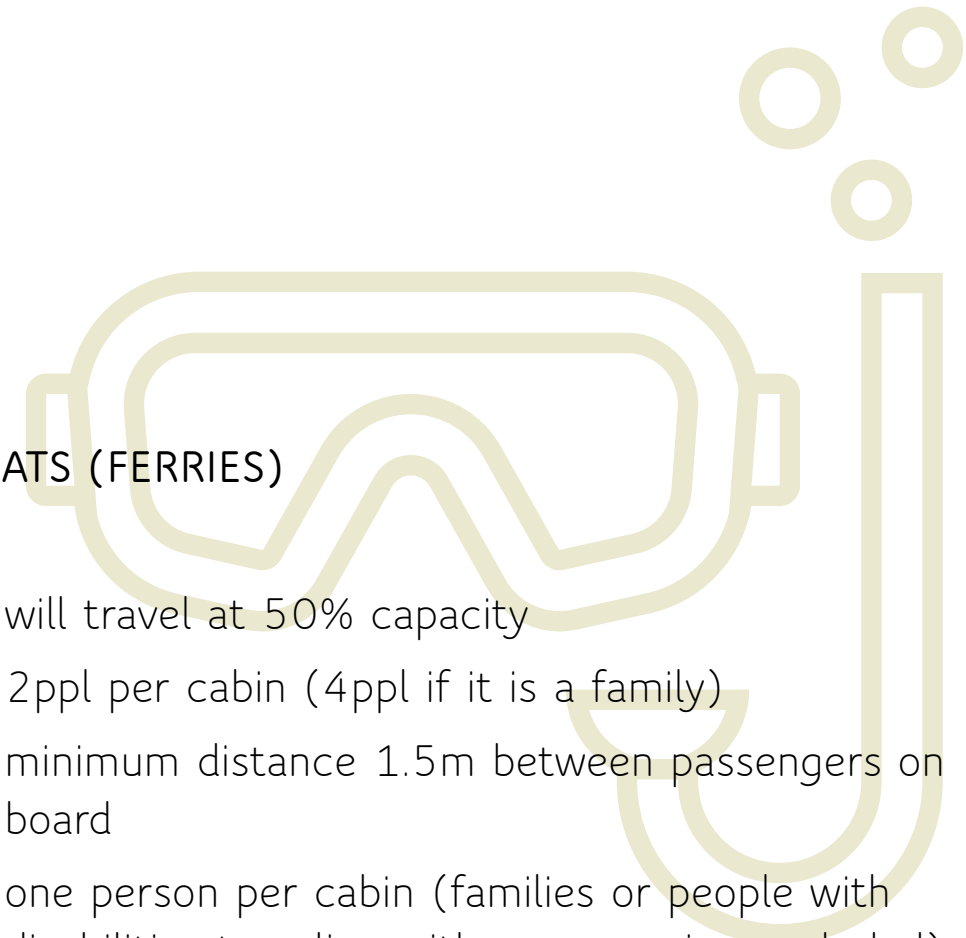

## BEACHES WITH ORGANIZED FACILITIES

- at organized beach clubs, a maximum of 40 people allowed per 1,000m<sup>2</sup>
- a minimum distance of 4m maintained between individual umbrellas
- maximum of 2 sun loungers under each umbrella (families excluded)
- use of towel on top of the sun lounger is mandatory
- sun loungers/chairs disinfected after every use
- regular disinfection of sanitary facilities with a cleaning schedule posted for official review

## BOATS (FERRIES)

- will travel at 50% capacity
- 2ppl per cabin (4ppl if it is a family)
- minimum distance 1.5m between passengers on board
- one person per cabin (families or people with disabilities traveling with a companion excluded)
- the use of a mask on board vessels is mandatory







# Hotels

---

## CHECK-IN/CHECK-OUT

- check-out now at 11 a.m. and check-in at 3 p.m. The extra time is necessary to ensure rooms are thoroughly disinfected between stays and are adequately ventilated
- plexiglass screen at reception is at the discretion of hotel management
- hand sanitizers are mandatory throughout the hotel
- hotel key cards disinfected after every stay
- check in and concierge apps and electronic payments strongly encouraged

Hotel employees undergo rapid testing once a week

Hotels of over 50 rooms have an action plan in place & protocols for each department. Staff are trained on this action plan. Hotels also required to have a doctor on call, who will act on the instructions of the National Health Authority.

Buffet service is reintroduced, with use of hand sanitizer at the start of the buffet & disposable gloves for guests serving themselves. Sneeze guards must in place at the buffet.

It is mandatory for all hotels to obtain the national "Health First" certification.



# Food & Drink

---

- minimum distance between tables ranges from 70cm to 170cm
- Social distancing rules apply
- sanitizer gel available at cash registers and/or on each table
- Only vaccinated guests allowed in indoor dining areas



# Nightlife

---

## LIVE PERFORMANCES

- No dancing allowed
- Only seated customers (no standing)
- Only vaccinated guests in indoor areas
- venues will operate at 50% capacity
- stage set at least 3m away from 1<sup>st</sup> row of seats





# Tour Buses

- operate at 85% capacity
- all passengers must wear protective masks on board
- all tour buses must provide hand sanitizer by the entrance
- companies are advised to install transparent protective dividers in buses between the driver and the passengers
- after each route, the cleaning of surfaces and high contact spots (e.g. handles) is advised\*

*\*our approved transport supplier applies rigorous disinfecting procedures after every route*

## TRANSFER CARS

- customer transport allowed via private transfers only
- Vehicles with up to 7 seats may carry up to 4 passengers plus the driver
- 8 - 9seaters can carry up to 6 passengers plus the driver
- the driver and passengers must all wear masks



# Yachts

---

- faraway destinations where medical help is scant are to be avoided
- maximum number of passengers on board will depend on boat's size & the capacity on license
- book with passenger details & hours of embarking and disembarking kept on board at all times during a charter
- the only people allowed on board will be the people who have boarded from the start of the journey
- no other passengers/visitors allowed on board at intermediate stops
- a log must be kept to monitor everyone's health
- crew & passengers will have their temperatures taken once daily and logged
- sufficient quantities of antiseptic, disinfectant, cleaning supplies and personal protection equipment for all on board
